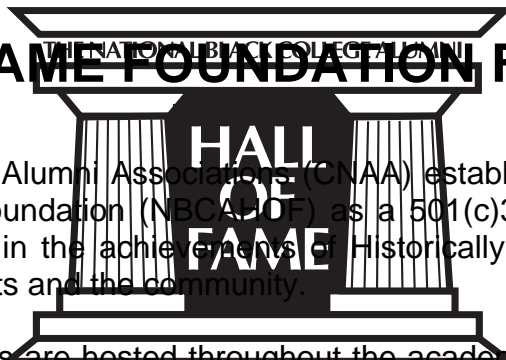


# HALL OF FAME FOUNDATION FACT SHEET



- The Council of National Alumni Associations (CNAA) established the National Black College Alumni Hall of Fame Foundation (NBCAHOF) as a 501(c)3 organization in 1985, to create awareness and interest in the achievements of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) alumni, students and the community.
- The NBCAHOF initiatives are hosted throughout the academic year in target markets. Major Programs include;
  - **The Positive Image Program** introduces elementary, middle and high school students about the influence and significance of HBCUs.
  - **The Legacy Lecture Series** links Hall of Fame Inductees, HBCU students and alumni, and community and business partners in effective interchange.
  - **The National Scholarship Service** provides information exchange between students and college representatives through one on one sessions and college fairs.
- More than 40,000 students receive financial assistance and broaden educational opportunities through the National Scholarship Service (NSS) annually.
- The NBCAHOF has awarded more than 630-thousand dollars in grants and scholarships to deserving students at member institutions in the past ten years.
- The NBCAHOF awards grants and scholarships in the following areas: Anheuser Busch Urban Scholars, Educational Book Scholarships, General Tuition Scholarships, Program Scholarships, Chefs of the World (Culinary Arts), Competition of Black College Queens, Black College Choir Competition and Black College Invitational Golf Tournament.
- The NBCAHOF relies on direct contributions and donations from corporate, education individual, community-based partners, and foundations.
- Fundraising efforts make major NCBAHOF initiatives possible, including the:
  - National Scholarship Service Program College Fairs
  - The Legacy Lecture Series
  - Chefs of the World: A Taste of Fame
  - HBCU Black College Invitational Golf Tournament (The largest NCAA sanctioned tournament for HBCUs in the nation)
  - The Hall of Fame Weekend Events
  - Competition of Black College Queens
  - Black College Gospel Choir Competition
- The NBCAHOF is governed by a 24-member board of trustees made up of education, community and business leaders. Several volunteers serve the Hall of Fame Foundation with their expertise in personnel, audit, scholarship selection, grant and investment review.
